The state engineer then examines the road and if he considers it of sufficient importance to warrant state aid, he orders a survey, together with plans and estimates of the cost of the improvement. These are then submitted by him to the board of supervisors, and if approved by the board, the contract is let and the road constructed under the supervision of the state engineer. Fifty per cent. of the cost of the improvement is paid by the state, thirty-five per cent. by the county, and fifteen per cent. by the town, or if the property owners have petitioned, by those whose lands are benefited. When completed the road must be kept in repair by the town. The state engineer is required to collect statistics and information concerning roads and advise with local oflicers and persons interested in road improvement. He must hold...
